



<b>Mosaic of Lakeshore Visitation Plan</b>	
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## I. BACKGROUND

On 06.18.2020, IDPH and the Governor of IL sent a notice on guidelines for Long Term Care Facilities to follow in order to provide outdoor visitation for their residents and visitors. This is a Fresh Air Visitation Plan for Mosaic of Lakeshore.

On September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 CMS released QSO-20-39-NH as additional guidance for nursing home visitation.

## II. PURPOSE

To create a plan that will meet IDPH, CMS, State and Local agencies recommendations for indoor and outdoor visitation for the residents and their visitors.

## III. VISITATION SPACE

### Outdoor

1. The designated area for outdoor visitation will be at the front entrance south of the entrance doors
2. (2) 6-foot tables and two- three chairs
3. The capacity of the outdoor seating will not exceed 2 visitors to ensure that a minimum distance of six feet is achievable (The 2 visitors must be from the same household)

### Indoor

1. The designated area for indoor visitation will be 1 North
2. Only Compassionate Care Visits can be held in a resident's room
3. (2) 6-foot table and two- three chairs
4. The capacity of indoor seating will not exceed 2 visitors to ensure that a minimum distance of six feet is achievable (The 2 visitors must be from the same household)
5. Instructional Signage will be placed throughout the facility

## IV. SCREENING

1. A designated staff member will be assigned to manage indoor and outdoor visitation.
2. Visitors will be required to call Mosaic of Lakeshore at 773-973-7200 and speak to the designated coordinator to schedule all appointments **(at least 72 hours in advance)**



3. 24 hours before the appointment, the coordinator will prescreen visitors via phone with the CDC symptom checklist asking if the visitor is currently having:
  - Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea.
4. On the day of the appointment, upon arrival at the facility, the visitors will be screened again with the CDC symptom checklist and a temperature check (using a non-contact temperature check)
5. Residents receiving visitors shall also be screened with the CDC symptom checklist prior to visitor's arrival.

#### **V. VISITATION**

1. Visitation will be limited to two visitors maximum at a time per resident.
2. Social distancing of six feet between the resident and visitors will be maintained.
3. The maximum number of visitors allowed in a single day will be 32
4. Maximum time/ duration of each visit will be 30 minutes
5. For the duration of the visit, the resident and visitor will be required to wear a face covering (cloth face mask is not acceptable) and practice social distancing.
6. The facility will have continuous supervision during each visit to ensure the use of face coverings and social distancing.

#### **VI. Health Care Workers and Other Providers of Services**

Health Care Workers who are not employees of the facility but provide direct care to the facility's residents such as hospice workers, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel, dialysis technicians, laboratory technicians, radiology technicians, social workers, clergy are permitted to enter the facility

#### **VII. DETERMINING COMMUNITY RATES**

Facility will use the COVID-19 count positivity rate, found on the [COVID-19 Nursing Home Data](#) site as additional information to determine how to facilitate indoor visitation

#### **VIII. WHO CANNOT PARTICIPATE?**

1. Residents with active COVID19 infection, either lab confirmed or symptomatic, are not allowed to participate in outdoor or indoor visitation. (Virtual Visits Only)
2. Residents who are on transmission- based precautions (Virtual Visits Only)
3. Visitors displaying symptoms should not visit the facility. (Virtual Visits Only)
4. Visitors lack of adherence to proper infection control practices or any other relevant related COVID-19 provisions.
